#### **FOURTH OF JULY THOUGHTS**

Only two people signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4<sup>th</sup>, John Hancock and Charles Thomson. Most of the rest signed on August 2, but the last signature wasn't added until 5 years later.

Have you ever wondered what happened to the 56 men who signed the Declaration of Independence?

Five signers were captured by the British as traitors, tortured before they died.

Twelve had their homes ransacked and burned. Two lost their sons serving in the Revolutionary Army; another had two sons captured.

Nine of the 56 fought and died from wounds or hardships of the Revolutionary War.

They signed and they pledged their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor.

What kind of men were they?

Twenty-four were lawyers and jurists. Eleven were merchants, nine were farmers and large plantation owners, men of means, well educated. But they signed the Declaration of Independence knowing full well that the penalty would be death if they were captured.

Carter Braxton of Virginia, a wealthy planter and trader, saw his ships swept from the seas by the British Navy. He sold his home and properties to pay his debts, and died in rags.

Thomas McKearn was so hounded by the British that he was forced to move his family almost constantly. He served in the Congress without pay, and his family was kept in hiding. His possessions were taken from him, and poverty was his reward.

Vandals or soldiers looted the properties of Dillery, Hall, Clymer, Walton, Guinett, Heyward, Ruttledge, and Middleton.

At the battle of Yorktown, Thomas Nelson Jr., noted that the British General Cornwallis had taken over the Nelson home for his headquarters. He quietly urged General George Washington to open fire. The home was destroyed, and Nelson died bankrupt. Francis Lewis had his home and properties destroyed. The enemy jailed his wife, and she died within a few months.

John Hart was driven from his wife's bedside as she was dying. Their 13 children fled for their lives. His fields and his gristmill were laid to waste. For more than a year he lived in forests and caves, returning home to find his wife dead and his children vanished. A few weeks later he died from exhaustion and a broken heart. Norris and Livingston suffered similar fates.

Such were the stories and sacrifices of the American Revolution. These were not wild-eyed, rabble-rousing ruffians. They were soft-spoken men of means and education. They had security, but they valued liberty more. Standing tall, straight, and unwavering, they pledged: "For the support of this declaration, with firm reliance on the protection of the divine providence, we mutually pledge to each other, our lives, our fortunes, and our sacred honor."

They gave you and me a free and independent America.

The history books never told you a lot about what happened in the Revolutionary War. We didn't fight just the British.

We were British subjects at that time and we fought our own government! Some of us take these liberties so much for granted, but we shouldn't. So, take a few minutes while enjoying your 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday and silently thank these patriots. It's not much to ask for the price they paid. Remember freedom is never free!

#### SHAFT OF LIGHT AND DOVE WINDOW

One of our Sanctuary stained glass windows depicts a shaft of light and a dove with an olive branch in its beak. The dove is the representation of the Holy Spirit, peace, reconciliation and forgiveness. The shaft of light behind the dove is a symbol of God the Creator.

The dove is mentioned 46 times in the Bible. The most important mention of the dove is in the four accounts of Jesus baptism in the Jordan River by John the Baptist (Matt. 3:16, Mark 1:10, Luke 3:22, and John 1:32). "As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him."

We first see the dove mentioned in the account of Noah and the flood (Genesis 6:9). After 40 days Noah sent out a dove but the dove could find no place to perch because the water still covered the earth. After 7 more days Noah sent the dove out once more. The dove returned with an olive branch in its beak and Noah knew the water had receded from the earth. After seven more days he once again sent the dove out and it did not return. After Noah and his family left the Ark along with all the animals Noah sacrificed burnt offerings on an altar that he built. God blessed the people with peace, forgiveness and the promise to never again destroy the earth. The dove is the only symbol given to the Holy Spirit. Scholars believe that the dove was chosen because of its calm disposition and gentle cooing.
