LISTENING TO GOD

God loves each of us enough to make a plan for each of our lives.

This plan was in place before we were born, for nothing about our lives is an accident.

This plan, while it is the best, is not always easy.

If we follow it we will reap the rewards of living according to God's will.

We can ask God to reveal His plan to us and then we can listen for directions to a God directed life.

As it says in Proverbs 3:5-6, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and he will make your paths straight."

We need to consider what God says, recognizing His great power, while trusting in His guidance and following His instructions.

Listen to God and have the ears to hear what God is saying to you.

How does God speak to us today?

His primary way is through His Word.

For it is the only source of truth.

He also speaks to us through prayer.

We can talk to God in prayer and He can talk to us in prayer.

He also may speak through circumstances.

When a situation is painful, we must remember that hearing from God is more important than our comfort and pleasure.

God uses difficult situations in our lives to get our attention and direct our path.

He also speaks through other people.

It can be in the form of affirmation, confirmation, encouragement, or even reproof or warning.

How can you know God's voice?

It is always consistent with His Word.

His voice is quiet and clear.

How does God get our attention?

He can use restlessness, or a gentle whisper, but we will know it is Him speaking.

Can we believe that God really speaks today?

Are you afraid of what He might say?

Are you angry with God? Or do you have a rebellious spirit.

If you ask and listen He will guide you.

If you are not listening to God you cannot receive His guidance or you will hear the wrong voices and you and others will suffer.

God will "impress" upon your spirit a problem or a direction for you.

Will you be sensitive to Him and follow His lead?

God will never force you to be His and follow His plan for you.

Brethren Disaster Ministries

As a long-term volunteer project leader with the Brethren Disaster Ministries (BDM) Rebuilding probram, I have had the privilege of experiencing this ministry from the "inside" for more than five years. I've been given the opportunity to see our denomination through different eyes: the eyes of service, compassion, and love. The one thing that keeps standing out to me is how we are united, as opposed to how we might be divided. The 'we" are volunteers who come from different districts across the denomination to serve together each week. I often comment to them during or end-of-week debriefing that this ministry is the best-kept secret of our denomination.

Why do I say that? Because those who come to serve strive for a common goal that we fulfill together. What is that common goal? To glorify God as we serve with our hands, feet, and hearts to help restore hope in our clients and the communities in which we serve. Because we have that common goal, we are united. Despite our differences, we are united. We are united because we are motivated by love – God's love for us and our love for Him – which in turn compels us to love our neighbor as ourselves. As Galatians 5:13-14 tells us: "Serve one another humbly in love. For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: Love your neighbor as yourself."

This is how we build the body and unite the church, week after week: through acts of service that provide opportunities to break down barriers and build relationships. Serving. United. Being the church.
