# SEEKING GODLY COUNSEL

1 Kings 12:1-15, Psalm 32:8 and Proverbs 3:5-6

Life is a series of decisions and we, as Christians, have God to give us direction. The problem is: do we listen to him? We also have other Christians to consult with regarding our decisions. Our goal should always be to seek godly counsel that will aid us in discovering God's will for our lives. Listening to the wrong counselors can lead to paying a high price. King Rehoboam listened to the wrong counsel and Israel paid a high price for it. We can learn from his folly.

How can you know bad counsel? Unwise counsel makes little reference to God or His Word. It will not contain prayer. Also Scripture will not be a part of that counsel. It can be very critical of Christian leaders or godly people. God's Word will be ignored. Often they give us what we want to hear. They can also try to control the one counseled. The counselor might try to create a sense of dependency on them.

We are called to trust in the Lord, heed his Word and follow his leadership. If we trust him for our salvation, surely we can trust him for guidance. The wisest counsel we could possibly find is in God's word. We should invest our time in learning Scripture and seeking help from those who know it well and can guide us to the right passages. Avoid counselors with an ungodly lifestyle. Some advisors may want to give you an out so you can escape your problem. God promises to walk through the problem with you and you will be stronger for the journey. Do not seek counsel from one who is seeking your approval. When we walk in the Spirit, He

gives us inner warnings, (checks), if we are heading in the wrong direction, thinking the wrong way, or making a wrong decision. Do not go to unbelievers for Godly counsel.

Ungodly counsel can lead to: the wrong decision; being deceived; being controlled; it may cost us financially; it can separate friends; it can injure your marriage; it can turn us away from trusting God and turn us to trusting a person; we might violate God's Word; and we might be lead astray and lead someone else astray as well.

When you talk to someone about your problems, what are you seeking? Support? Sympathy? Agreement? Direction? Or God's viewpoint? What criteria do you use for choosing a counselor? How important is it to you that the advice is shaped by the Word of God? When trouble strikes, do you know where to find God's answer in His Word? What can you do now to ensure that you will be familiar enough with Scripture to know what He desires?

# **LIVE STREAMING REPORT**

A couple of years ago, I had a vision of making sure the Empire Church of the Brethren worship services would go online. I thought about it constantly and even asked other members of the congregation if they thought this was a good idea. I received good feedback. The only question was when we were going to do it.

In May 2021, the PSWD Policy Board had a meeting and on the agenda was a proposal for a Live Stream fund for each congregation. The district wanted to help each congregation who

wasn't setup to go live online have the ability to do so while going through the pandemic. The proposal was to provide equipment up to \$2,000 to get this setup. As a member of the policy board, I saw this proposal being presented at the meeting and I had to jump on this right away because I felt the district and I had the same goal. The policy board passed the proposal. From there, I presented to the local Empire COB Board, and they approved the decision to move forward with the Live Streaming project.

During the summer 2021, Russ Matteson, District Executive Minister and I went to work on this project. Russ ordered the tech equipment which includes Lenovo laptop, ATEM Mini switcher, a 4-channel sound mixer, a Canon Camcorder with a tripod, and bunch of different cables to go along with everything. I did some research on what software I wanted to use, and I found a program called OBS (Open Broadcaster Software). It is free program to help stream live to the internet. Also, I planned on uploading the videos to the church YouTube channel. And then down the road taking those YouTube videos and posting them to our website once everything looks good and everything is working correctly.

Not everything worked correctly at first. Russ and I spent a lot time at the church trying to fix any issues that occurred during set up. The first issue we ran into was problems with the video. We weren't getting the laptop to recognize the camcorder via HDMI cable. I tried to plug an HDMI cable from the laptop to the camcorder. No go. I tried to plug an HDMI cable to the ATEM mini, then plug another HDMI cable from the ATEM mini to the laptop. Still no go. What it took to get this to work after some time of troubleshooting was getting a USB-C to USB-C cable and we link that from the laptop to the ATEM mini. Getting the video to work with OBS and other video editing programs was success.

The second issue that we had to tackle was the sound. On October 10th, we decided to go live for the first time. After the video was posted on YouTube, I went to look to see how it turned out, and there was absolutely no sound coming from the video clip. I spent weeks trying to find out what the issue was. The sound wasn't coming through OBS. And that meant the sound wasn't going through YouTube during the live stream. The camcorder did record sound and I was able to take that sound with the video, compress the file to a smaller size, upload the video to YouTube a few hours or even a day later. I was able to upload a few Sunday Worship Services by going about this method for a few weeks. Then in December, Russ and I went back to the church to try a few different ideas. We got assistance from a guy Russ knew named Joseph. His church live stream setup is similar to how we are trying to get ours setup. He was able to give us a couple ideas in which one of those ideas helped to get this closer to where we want to be. We started to work with the AFV function on the ATEM mini. Once this was turned on, the sound from the church sound system started to go through the OBS software. And when that happens, it will go to YouTube. Russ came by and assisted me on a Sunday Service as he ran the camcorder and I watched over the live stream on the laptop, making sure everything looked good. One of our church members was a big help, watching our service live on YouTube during that Sunday and let us know in the chat whether she was able to hear the sound and what the sound quality was like. There were some adjustments that needed to be made, but Russ was able to figure out we can do that on the sound mixer. The audio cable from the sound system is directly plugged into the ATEM Mini with AFV function turned on is how we were able to pull sound to the live stream. That part was a success.

These were the two main issues, but there are some other issues that may occur. One issue is getting the Wi-Fi extender to work on a weekly basis. We needed to get a Wi-Fi extender connected in the sanctuary to get enough Wi-Fi signal, so we won't be running into issues regarding connect ability and buffering. We also need a Wi-Fi extender to connect to the basement so the church Sunday School class can use Zoom during their meetings. Using two Wi-Fi extenders seems to be another challenge. Currently I am working on that issue.

Overall, I think things are looking good. We are getting our services online and I am happy that this project has come to fruition. There are going to be some tweaks from time to time because technology is never perfect by any means, but it's been a blessing along the way. I would like to personally give a big Thank You to District for making this possible financially to get us up and going. Also, to Russ for all the hours and hours of working with me to get this up and going. And to the Empire Church and Board, for believing in me to run this and make this happen for our congregation. There is still a lot more work to be done but right now this project has been a success at this point, but more importantly, it has been a LEARNING one (and I stressed that).
