TODAY IS YOUR BEST DAY BECAUSE CHRIST IS IN YOU

For it has pleased God to tell His people that the riches and glory of Christ are for you Gentiles, too. For this is the secret: Christ lives in you, and this is your assurance that you will share in His glory. Colossians 1:27 NLT

One of the glorious things about the Christian life is that God not only places you in Christ, but Christ also comes to live in you. It is one thing to be standing in a river and enjoy its benefits as it washes and refreshes you; it is another thing to have the river in you as a result of drinking from its waters. When the river is in you, you receive benefits that differ from the benefits you receive when you are standing in the river. The water now becomes a part of your being as it nourishes your body and supplies it with the minerals it needs to survive.

Being in Christ means that you receive the benefits of all that He has done for you through His death, burial, resurrection, and ascension; Christ being in you means that you receive the benefits of His presence, His character, and His nature within you.

- Being in Christ changes your position before God; Christ being in you changes the inward condition of your heart.
- Being in Christ brings you into heavenly realities; Christ being in you brings heavenly realities into your earthly walk.

- Being in Christ opens your eyes to the beauty of God's love; Christ being in you floods your heart with that same love.
- Being in Christ allows you to see what God wants you to become; Christ being in you means that you can become what God wants you to be.

Christ in you means that He has begun a good work in you, that He will sustain the work He has begun, and that He will complete the work He has begun. Christ in you means that He does the work of conforming you to His image, that He is the Master Craftsman who is shaping your life, and that He is the True Vine who is producing the good fruit of eternal life within you. Christ in you means that His strength is your strength, His peace is your peace, His power is your power, and His victory is your victory.

God is not asking you to act like Jesus today. He is asking you to surrender to Jesus and trust Him completely to be your life today. Letting Jesus be Jesus in you and through you makes this your best day. Trying to act like Jesus will only wear you down and tire you out. Expecting your efforts to be fruitful would be like cutting a branch off an apple tree and expecting it to grow apples. The reason an apple tree grows apples is because everything in an apple tree is designed for apples – within the sap is the life of every apple.

Think of this one truth as you go through this day: "Everything that is good, wise, loving, righteous, true, wonderful, kind, and caring is in Jesus Christ, and Jesus Christ is living His life in me."

Prayer of Jubilation and Simplicity

Recently I heard Max Lucado on the radio describe how we should pray. I loved it so much that I want to share it with you. This is what I recollect from what I heard, plus a bit of my own added to it.

First of all, we have to set the scene. The scene is that school has just been let out for the day and parents are picking up their children. A father comes to the front of the school and his son sees him and starts running to him. His dad picks him up, swings him around, and asks, "How was your day?" His son says, "Dad! My day was great! You should have seen how I spelled today! My teacher was so excited that I remembered how to spell using the correct vowel teams. I had worked so hard on it!" Another father gets out of his car and his daughter spots him from a distance. She instantly beams and when their eyes connect there is such love and affection. When the father gets to his daughter he kneels down and the two embrace in a bear hug with exuberant smiles on their faces. The father instantly knew that no matter what her day had

entailed that their connection was all that mattered at that moment. His daughter then began to talk, "Dad, my day started out just as any other day. Then I made a mistake on my morning work. Then, during math, I could not understand how to multiply my fractions. I worked hard and made progress, but I was wondering if you could help me some more this afternoon. The rest of the day went pretty good, but I just kept wishing I could get those fractions. I knew when I saw you that things were going to be ok! Thanks Dad!"

As we pray, we need to pray like these children who saw their fathers and just started telling them how their day went. They shared their joys and trials of the day. They did not use fancy words or take time to word their thoughts perfectly. They just spoke what was on their hearts. They were so excited to see their fathers that the words just started pouring out of their mouths. This month as we pray, let us be like those kids. Let us pray with such jubilation to our Heavenly Father; our Papa, our safe landing place when all else seems to be spinning out of control, our source of joy and love, our protector. Let us come to Him with such joy, and simply spill whatever is on our hearts to Him, so He can gather us up in His arms and let us know that everything will be ok. Because God's Got It!


