BRETHREN BITS

We have a Brethren Disaster Ministries rebuilding update from Paradise, California in the Summer Issue of Brethren Disaster Ministries newsletter. The article reads, "During the week of Feb. 26-March 4, 2023, the Pacific Southwest District (PSWD) provided seven volunteers to work on four homes in Paradise, California. They work in partnership with Mennonite Disaster Service which has been working in the area for years, providing leadership and volunteers. This area was devastated by the Camp Fire in 2018, considered California's deadliest and most destructive fire, in which 88 people died. The PSWD team completed various rebuilding tasks but they were also impacted by a serious snowstorm. Proving that flexibility is required on any job site, their tasks included shoveling over a foot of snow so that sub-contractors could get into a home. They also had to cut short their week of work.

Please be in prayer for the teams that will go to continue work in Kentucky for a second project for ten weeks, scheduled from September 10 through the week before Thanksgiving. They are helping the people that had heavy rain, flash flooding, and devastating river flooding to eastern Kentucky and the surrounding areas. Some of these areas received rainfall of 4 inches an hour and totaled over 10 inches in two days, claiming the lives of 39 residents, with over 13,000 families applying for assistance from FEMA.

Please also be in prayer for the upcoming Disaster Response Auction on September 22nd & 23rd by the Atlantic Northeast and Southern Pennsylvania districts at the Lebanon Valley Expo Center in Lebanon, Pennsylvania. Brethren Disaster Ministries benefits from the proceeds of these auctions, and greatly helps them continue the work they are doing to serve others in their greatest times of need. Jigsaw Puzzle Piece Prayer

This month our prayer requires a tool to help conceptualize the idea. Please grab a puzzle piece of any kind and pray in the following manner.

- 1. Hold the puzzle piece in your hand and pray for yourself. Ask God to help you with any need you may have. Thank Him for the good things He is doing and has provided in your life. Ask Him to help you see the big picture of the plan He has for you and your life.

At this time pray for people who find it hard to fit in, people who have moved to a new place, people who feel they are all alone, or people who may be struggling with something. Pray that they find peace in Jesus, comfort in Jesus, and happiness, in the midst of their struggle.
- 5. Lastly, hold your piece and think of someone from your community, your friends or family that you would like to pray for. Thank God for the person that He has connected you with, and ask God to bless and help them in His mighty way!
