THE PRIORITY OF PRAYER

Prayer is one of the most important activities in our lives because we are actually talking to the sovereign **God** of the universe who has all power and knowledge. He understands how we feel, knows what we think, and has the power to intervene in every area of life. Yet despite the Lord’s willingness to listen and answer our requests, we are not always faithful in prayer. When times are good, we may forget to pray. Or maybe we doubt that God will answer. But the biggest hindrance to prayer is sin. If we are unwilling to acknowledge our sins and ask for the Lord’s forgiveness, we will have no desire to talk to a holy God.

Paul says to “*Pray without ceasing.*” *1 Thess. 5:17*. Paul was encouraging people who were being persecuted. The enemy was obvious. He is just as active in our lives though often not so obvious. Prayer is not an option for a victorious life. It is a necessity. Paul was speaking of a continual recurrence. Prayer should recur frequently throughout the day. It is to focus our attention on God consistently. Starting the day in prayer helps this to happen. Throughout the day we should be in contact with God about what we are facing. At the end of the day we will be ready to thank him for being with us throughout the day. Father God wants to listen and answer our prayers. God knows our needs but he wants us to know them and acknowledge them. One way God shows us his love for us is in answering our prayers. We may not deserve his mercy, grace, and love, but he freely gives it because of our relationship with him through **Jesus Christ**. To have such a prayer life requires a relationship with God. To have a relationship with God requires **belief in Jesus Christ his Son**. No one can bypass Christ and expect that the Lord will grant their requests. When we humble ourselves, confess our sins, and claim Jesus as our personal savior God will forgive us and respond to our needs. False prayers are about self and are based on what we think we deserve. True prayer comes from a sense of humility, realizing that we are accepted on the basis of the Lord’s mercy not by our conduct. It is a dialogue with God because we are not just interested in giving Him our list of requests, but we want to hear from him and live in the middle of his will for our lives.

True prayer is a way to grow in our relationship with God. It requires two-way communication. We must also listen to God. Since his **Word** is the primary way he speaks to us, our prayer time should include **Bible**

reading. We are called to devote ourselves to prayer. Devotion requires that we not only set aside uninterrupted time for prayer, but that we also think seriously about what we are asking. We must give God the time and attention he deserves in order to have a growing relationship with him.

The time we spend with God directly affects our lives. It is how God comforts us, strengthens us, forgives us, guides us, shields us, encourages us, and heals us. Prayer can impact people anywhere in the world because it creates a holy triangle between us, God and whomever we pray for. Ask yourself how often do you pray? Is it a part of your daily life? Are you confident that God will answer your prayer? Do you take everything to God in prayer?

Like everything else in this life, it is up to you!

ON A WING AND A PRAYER

Gene Coulon Memorial Beach Park was a beautiful spot for a stroll. But on this summer evening, as I walked up a grassy knoll overlooking Lake Washinton, screams rang out. At the top of a 20-foot tree was a bird of prey. With chocolate brown wings, a white breast and a brown-and-white head, I knew it was an osprey. It was crying out in distress. A couple was sitting on a bench near the tree. The man was on his cell phone.

"It's so badly hurt," the woman said. "My husband and I have been trying to call the Audubon Society, with no luck."

It obviously can't fly, I thought. The bird's left wing was hanging too low. The feathers at the tip were all twisted up. I ran to my car and came back with a list of animal rescue organizations I keep handy. I tried the first number – no answer. I tried another number. The phone rang uselessly.

A sentence ran through my head like a ticker tape: *No human will be able to help this bird*. But there is one who can, no matter the circumstances. I hung up and prayed. "Jesus, you said we can do greater things than you with the faith of a mustard seed," I said. "So with that faith, I am asking for a healing miracle."

The moment I finished, the osprey stopped screaming. It began to shake. The movement started in its good right wing, then passed through its body. Finally its injured wing began to vibrate.

Then the bird's dangling left wing moved back up into place. The mangled feathers at the end came together. It stretched out both wings to their full six-foot span and glided gently from the tree. The three of us watched the osprey soar off over the water, a prayer answered right in front of our eyes.
