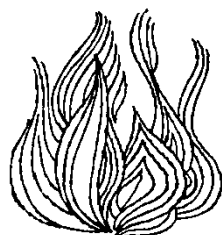

My daughter, Amy and I were getting ready to drive to the supermarket. *I’ll put on some Colton Dixon in the car*, I thought. Amy liked his songs. I liked the Christian message in them. I was always looking for ways to encourage my daughter to pray, but she was a natural doubter – and a teenager! If I pushed too hard, I knew she’d stop listening for sure.

We stepped down the three stairs that led to the garage and found my husband, Bob, standing by his old Mustang, looking toward the ceiling.

“It’s a hummingbird,” he said, pointing to something tiny floating far out of reach. “He flew in, but I don’t think he knows how to get out.”

“Maybe he was attracted by the red car,” I said. “It’s bright like a flower.”

“I don’t think he feels safe in here,” Amy said. “Doesn’t he seem kind of worried to you?”

For 30 minutes, the three of us tried everything we could think of to get the bird out.

I tempted him with some peach juice that I'd poured into a shallow cup. No luck.

Amy ran out to the yard and picked a colorful peony. She followed the hummingbird around the garage, holding the flower high, but the bird kept his distance. Finally her arm dropped in defeat.

The bird perched on the garage door mechanism in the middle of the ceiling. I watched him, standing by a pegboard where our snowsuits hung for the summer. "I give up," I said. "There's nothing else we can do."

"Why don't we pray for him?" Amy said.

I stared at her in surprise. Had my doubting teenage daughter just suggested praying for the bird? And why hadn't *I* thought of that?

"Jesus, please send the bird down so we can help him," I said. We all turned our eyes back to the hummingbird. The more he flitted, the more we fretted. Thirty seconds. Forty-five. The bird flew up. He swooped down toward the pegboard and slid down a snowsuit – right into Amy's waiting hands.

She cupped him gently in her palms, walked quickly outside and let him go.



WHEN THE LAST CHILD GOES TO SCHOOL

One of the foremost exponents of modern-day terrorism is the woman who asks, "What are you going to do with yourself when all your children are in school?"

They go on to paint a dismal picture of the lonely mother who plucks a pair of sticky socks off the ceiling and sobs uncontrollably into them, "My baby! My baby!" A woman who wanders through the house, unfulfilled and fighting bravely against the realization that she's being replaced by a 35-cent plate lunch and a woman she'd like to sue for alienation of affection. A disillusioned woman without purpose who must fill her time somehow until the big yellow bus deposits her brood at the curb so she can once again run and fetch!

For many a woman, this will be a rather accurate prediction. She's the woman who didn't have many interests going for her in the first place. When the children came along, it was the answer to her problem. Here was her crutch, her ace in the hole, her reason for not having to go outside the home, invent diversions, meet new friends, put up her hair, read a book or function as a woman. She wore her children like a hair shirt and told everyone how they depended upon her – when it was the other way around.

To most women, however, the school bell will sound as glorious as VE Day. It's over. She's done it. She is back to some semblance of a schedule, some precious time to herself. She wanted children too, but for another reason. They fulfilled a strong desire to love, raise and leave as a legacy another human being. But they didn't fulfill her ambitions, her struggle for individuality or her need to make a contribution to this life, no matter how small.

I have seen women emerge like great beautiful butterflies from a cocoon existence that was limited to naps and peanut butter. I have seen them assume leadership, develop and grow into active citizens, unearth artful talents that surprised everyone – even themselves, revert to skills they had BB (Before Babies), and set about restoring their own personal appearance.

I have also seen them sink into despondency, scrub the kitchen twice a week to pass the time and mechanically mouth the same old routine, “I can’t . . . (name anything). I’ve got the children.”

From a woman who has lived through the “last one into school” bit, may I give you a piece of advice. Allow yourself the luxury of that one last look as he waves goodbye from the bus. Pour yourself a cup of coffee and have a good cry for at least five minutes. Then, if you haven’t suffered enough, walk slowly through the house and let the quiet pound at your eardrums. If you like, enjoy a round of guilt complex. (“Why was I so rotten to him all summer?”)

Now, straighten your shoulders, take a deep breath and look out of your window. There’s a big world out there. You earned it! Now, enjoy it!



SEVEN SURPRISING LABOR DAY FACTS

**And *where* those rules about white after the holiday came from, while we’re at it.

Labor Day is one of the least recognized, forgotten-about-until-around-the-corner holidays of the year – one that we seem to appreciate only *after* realizing it affords us a three-day weekend come September. Here, seven tidbits you probably never knew about the holiday.

1. **The first Labor Day celebration was September 5, 1882 in New York City.** On that Tuesday, 10,000 citizens marched for labor rights down the streets of Manhattan. During this time the average American worked 12 hours a day, six days a week. It wasn’t until the Adamson Act passed on September 3, 1916 that our modern eight-hour work day was established.
2. **The holiday is often confused with “May Day”.** Most other countries celebrate International Worker’s Day, or “May Day,” instead of Labor Day. The concept is the same, but it is celebrated on May 1st around the globe.
3. **The theory about why we can’t wear white after Labor Day is highly debated.** There are three hypotheses about the origins of the “no white after Labor Day” directive. The first theory, disagreed upon by many, is based on class distinction in the early 1900s. Although white clothing was clearly an upper class luxury, after the Civil War it became harder to distinguish women coming from old money or new money. The higher class ladies then made inane fashion rules to weed out those who were “out of place.” The second theory speaks to a more practical approach by pointing out that Memorial Day and Labor Day bracketed the summer season, and therefore lighter, summery, white clothes were no longer needed. The last theory has to do with popular fashion magazines, who may have begun promoting fall clothing after Labor Day, and the trend was picked up.
4. **Labor Day ironically causes some of the longest working hours for retail workers.** Labor Day weekend is notorious for having crazy sales. But unfortunately, this means retail workers (a faction that makes up 6% of the country’s employment system) have to work longer hours on a day specially dedicated to labor appreciation. In fact, many other professionals are expected to work on Labor Day as well including correctional officers, police officials, firefighters, nurses, and more.
5. **Labor Day is the official end of hot dog season.** We’re serious. It’s recorded as such on the National Hot Dog & Sausage Council website.

- 6. **It is the second most dangerous holiday weekend to drive on U.S. highways.** According to *CBS News*, there were 308 casualties over Labor Day weekend between 2001 to 2015, following closely behind Memorial Day's 312 casualties. These particular holidays designate the beginning and ending of summer where excitement is heightened and young people tend to be more reckless on the road.
- 7. **The holiday also symbolizes other endings and beginnings.** Yes, Labor Day is the "unofficial end of summer" and the end of hot dog season. But it is also the beginning of NFL season – almost every NFL kick off game has started the weekend after Labor Day. Labor Day is the end of white pants but the beginning of black pants . . . and it's also, unfortunately, the end of three day weekends until November.
